The sacred centers of Mithila having allegiance with lord Shiva, mention may be made of Kapileshwar Asthan (District of Madhubani), Kusheshwar (Darbhanga), Singheshwar (Saharsha), Bideshwar (Madhubani), Bhairabnath and Garibnath (Bhagalpur), Ugranath (Near Pandaul) Somnath (Saurath Village, Madhubani) Kupeshwarnath (Near Jabalpur, Nepal)

History And Belief

The temple of Kapileshwar Baba (Of Lord Shiva) is a famous temple in our Mithilanchal. This famous temple built by Darbhanga Maharaja. The temple area spread over 52 hectare. The compound comprise of big pond, mango yard etc.

According to local belief, it was the great saint Kapil Muni who installed the lord Shiva Linga here. That's why the name of this lord Shiva became Kapileshwar Baba (Mahadev).

According to some other believe, while returning from Sri Ram Vivah, saint kapil muni was very much impressed with the location (where is Kapileshwar asthan now) and decided to install the lord Shiva.

Every day large number of devotees' come to temple for darshan and blessing. During sravan month, lakhs of devotees come to offer pray and to seek blessing.



Source of Revenue:

- Daan by devotees
- Rental from the small traders within the temple premises
- Donations

Current Problems:

Trespassing by local people and small traders

Poor drainage system - leads to overflow of water from pond to main temple.

Daharmshala in the mandir premises, built by Bihar Govt is in very bad shape.

Vivah Bhawan, newly constructed by Sri Tarakant Jha not yet transferred to Parvati Trust.

The temple premises falls under two different Panchayat. Lack of consensus between the Panchayats for development.
